MAJU Hosts 10th IEEE International Multitopic Conference

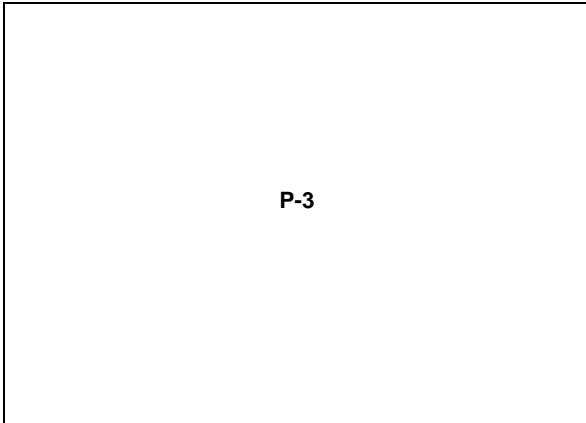

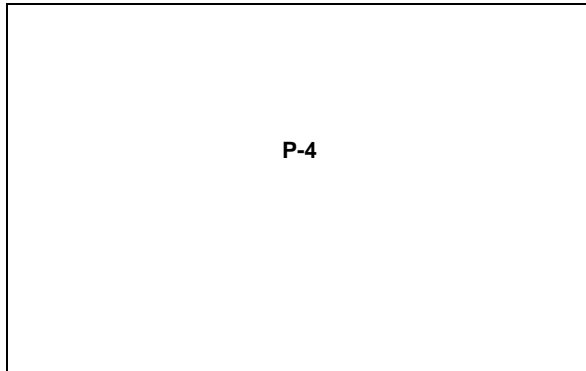

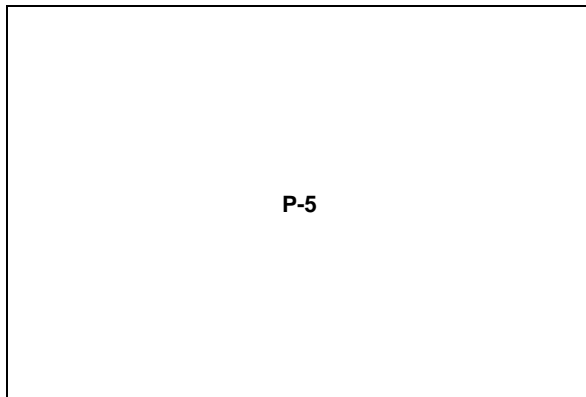
institutions had improved tremendously, and industries should exploit this potential by investing more to have a

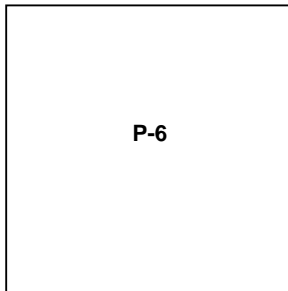
Head of Department of Social Sciences and Humanities also joined the seminar.

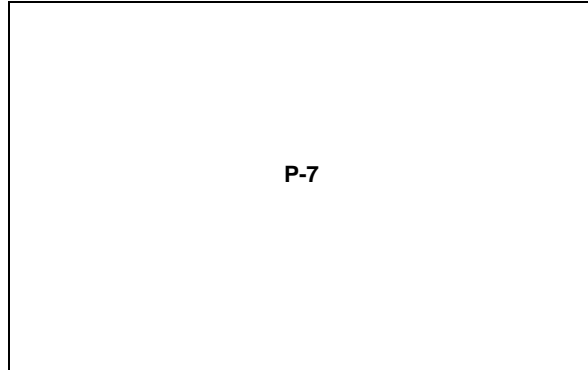

Naeemullah translated the chief guest's into English for the benefit of all.

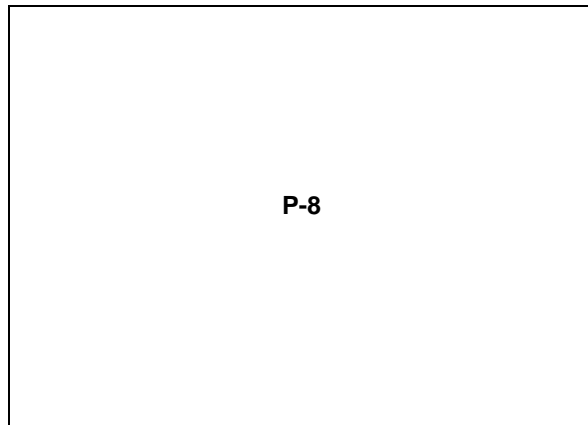
Mr. Ansir Rajput, Head of Business Administration also joined the informal discussion that took place while refreshments were being served.

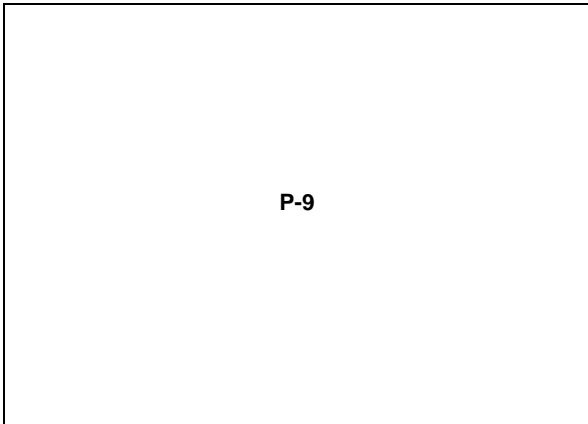

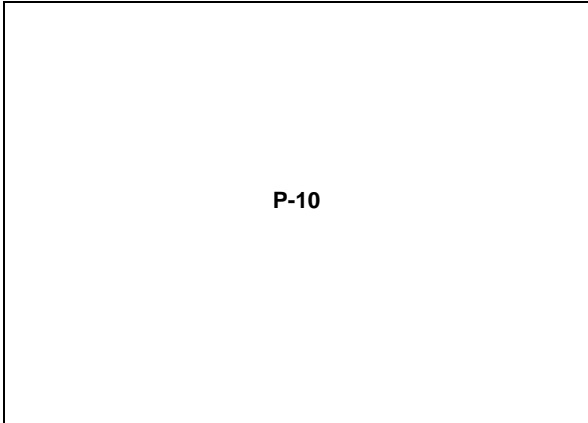
The event was very well organized and informative for the students as well as for the general public who showed keen interest in the MAJUniversity's academic programs.

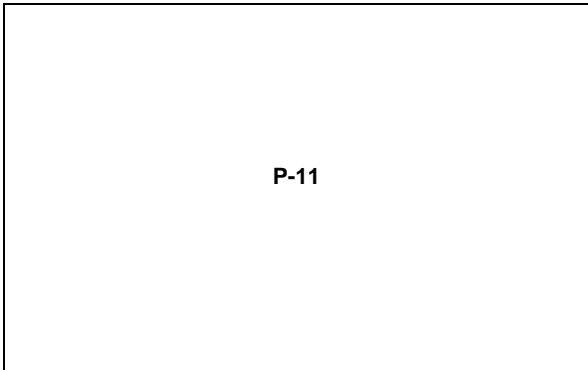

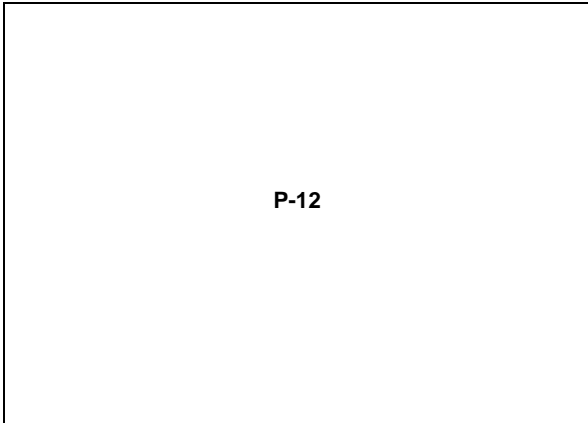

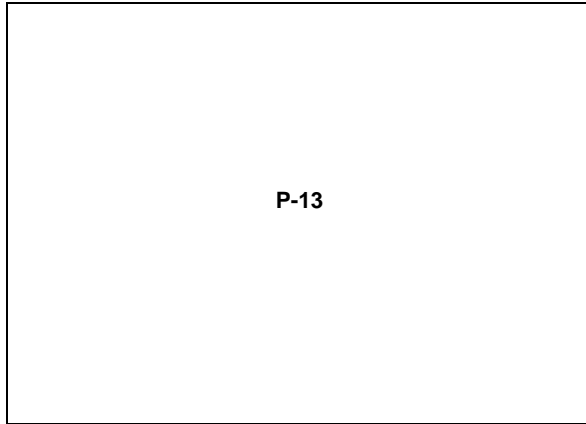

Sale! Sale! Sale! Soap, T-shirts, Handbags and Bangles

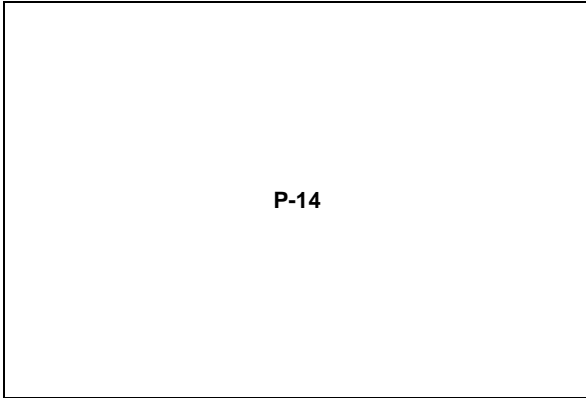

temperature was a bit high the students focused in their task. The heat didn't even bother them.



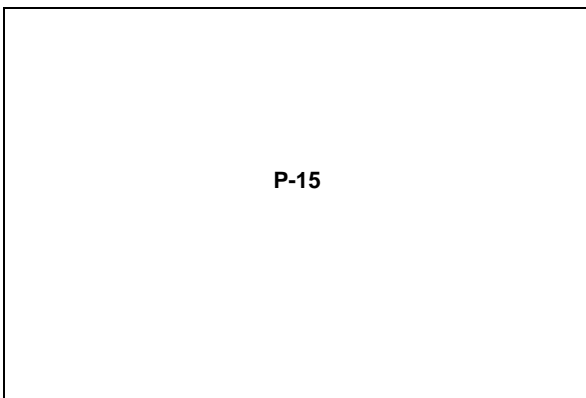

Rock & Roll With NEXUS

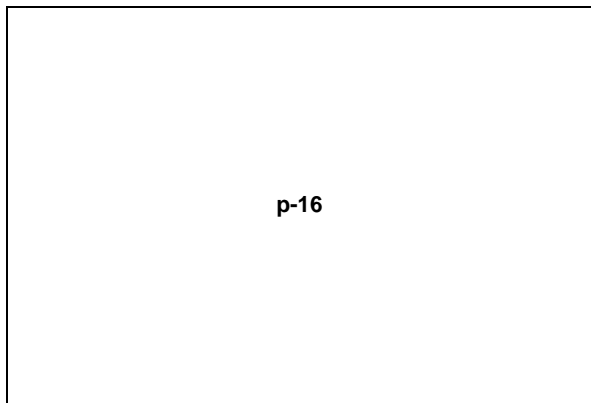

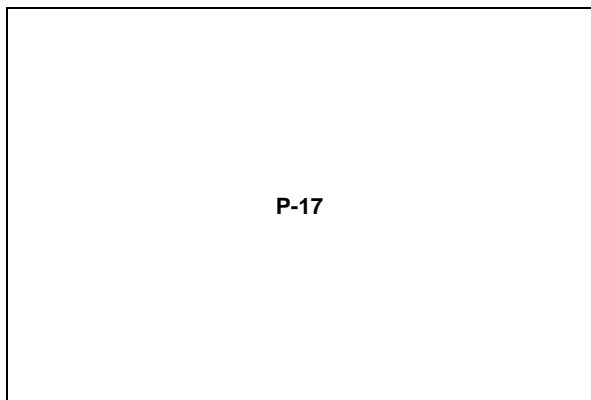


At the end of the function, dinner was served to the faculty and NEXUS members.

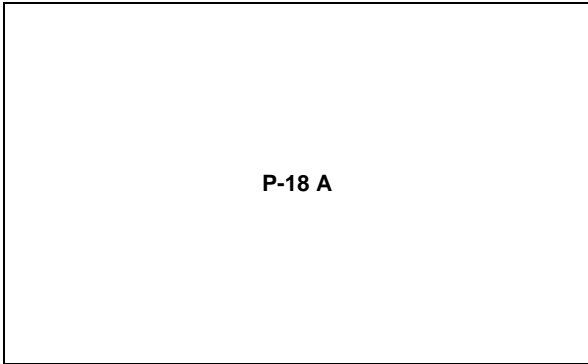

Tigers Versus Lions

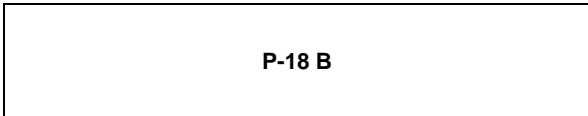

Both the teams captained by twin brothers played well. The Lions won the match and the score was 6-5. The crowd enjoyed the thrilling match.

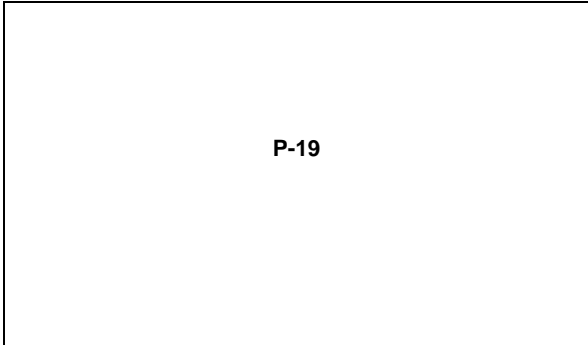

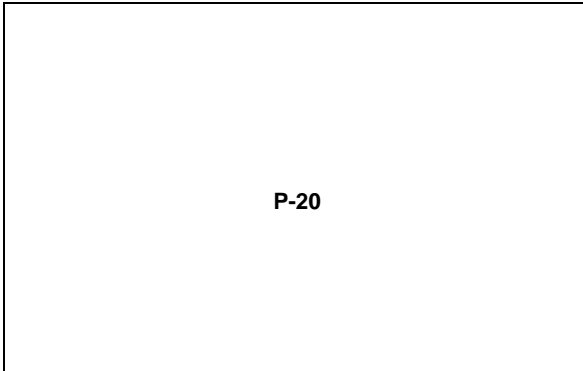
The basic theme of this program was to get the true picture of the Karachi issue. The students also participated in the question and answer session.

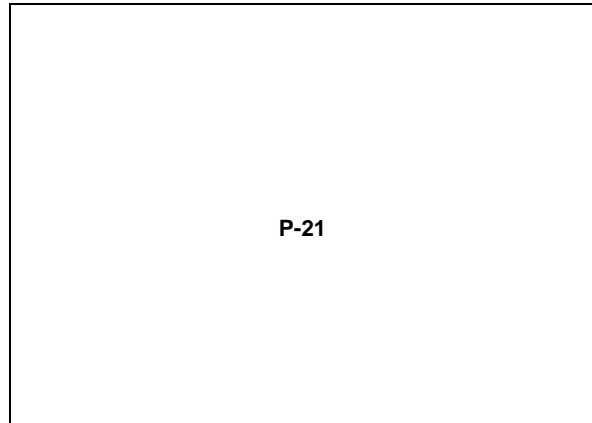

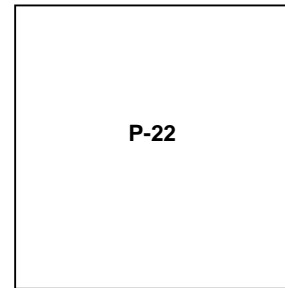
MAJU Students Make Proud Volunteers of N.C.H.D

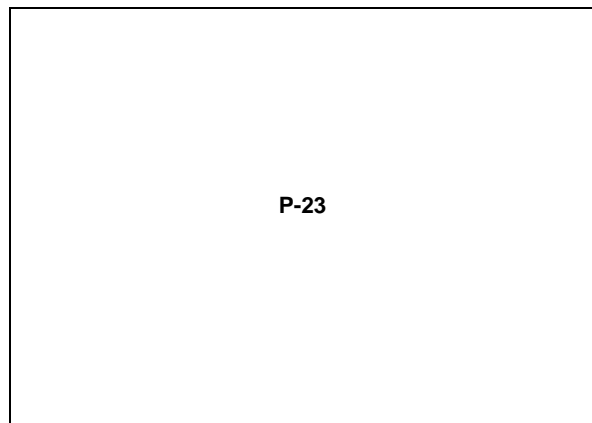
Consultation Workshop in Colombo

Discussion of Genetic Diseases

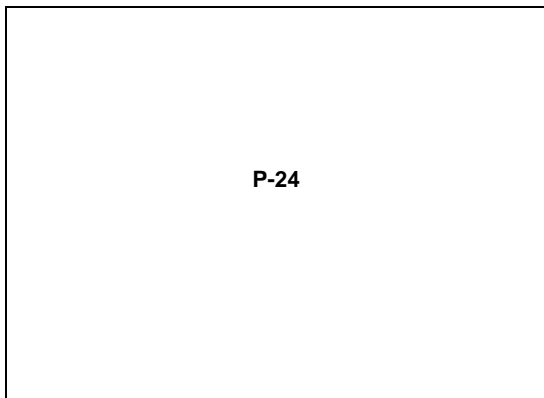

The main focus of the discussion was the identification of genetic defects through the phenotypes. The cases discussed were baldness, polydactyl and syndrome related to facial malformation.

He pointed out the sporadic cause of these diseases in Pakistan are the family marriages and the study of such disorders is a time consuming job. He concluded that these genetic disorders could be restored through gene therapy.

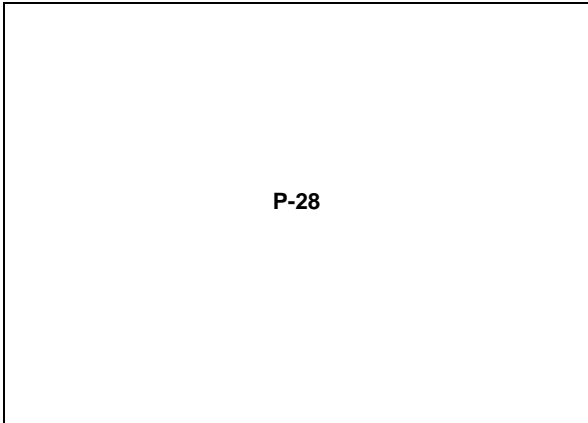
The speakers concluded the seminar by complimenting the BBA students and said that they would excel in the market and would prove themselves as successful managers if given the right kind of opportunities.

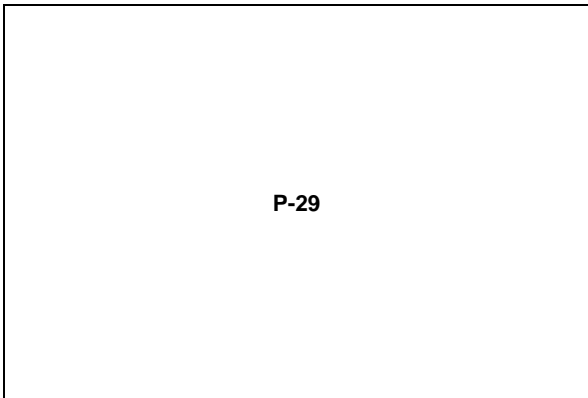

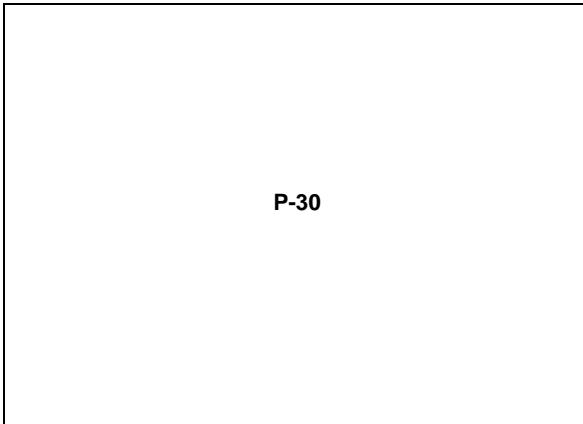

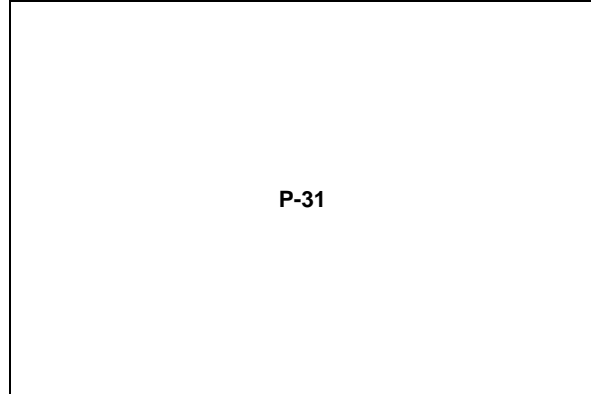
The guest speaker was Mr. Rizwan Hassan Khan (CFO) "Askari Investment Management". This seminar focused on different planning and decision making methodologies.
